Heritage experts are keen to give inspiration

HERITAGE experts will be in Londonderry next week to share their knowledge on how best to save 25 of the city's most historic but at-risk buildings.

They include early 19th century Learmount Castle and Old Water-side Train Station, built in 1852.

Members of the Prince's Regeneration Trust (PRT) are bringing their regeneration roadshow to the Inner City Trust offices at 31-33 Shipquay Street, which has already benefited from the restoration project.

Helen Quigley from Inner City Trust, the event's guest speaker, said: "This is a chance for everyone to share experiences and knowledge within the heritage regeneration field."

Ros Kerslake, from The Prince's Regeneration Trust, said: "I would urge any community groups interested in a heritage regeneration project to seize this opportunity to learn from experts, network with other similar organisations and be inspired."

The BRICK workshop is on Wednesday, October 14, at the Inner City Trust offices in Shipquay Street from 10am to 4.30pm.
